1. GFSE Event: Innovative solutions to tackle energy poverty

2. GFSE Policy Brief 18: SDG7 - Tackling Energy Poverty through Renewable Energy Solutions

The report highlights the urgent need to address energy poverty and the widening renewable energy gap and emphasizes the importance of stronger financing mechanisms and international cooperation to expand clean energy access. It shows the transformative role of Productive Uses of Renewable Energy (PURE), such as solar irrigation and off-grid refrigeration, in improving agriculture, health and economic growth in the Global South. It also explores gender disparities in energy access, the importance of off-grid and decentralized energy systems, and the need for policy innovation to achieve universal energy access by 2030.

It also examines opportunities for skill-building, job creation, and local procurement, while emphasizing the critical role of women in renewable energy systems. These projects aim not only to enhance energy access but also to deliver lasting socio-economic benefits for surrounding communities, fostering resilience, sustainability, and empowerment.

Under the theme 'Cooperatives Build Prosperity for All', discussions focused on four pillars: reaffirming cooperative identity, enabling supportive policies, developing strong leadership and building a sustainable future. The event concluded with the adoption of the New Delhi Action Agenda, a roadmap for enhancing the global impact of cooperatives in advancing sustainability, inclusion and economic resilience.
